Afterschool programs make a difference in student achievement.

» At an elementary school in Marshalltown, students raised their reading proficiency 39% over four years of participation in a high-quality summer learning program. By 2015, these students' reading proficiency of 83% exceeded the district's reading proficiency by 21%.

- » According to the Iowa Department of Education, principals and teachers report that when at-risk children participate in a high-quality afterschool program, there are fewer office referrals and behavior at school improves.
